Questions sent to the Parish Clerk for discussion were as follows: A resident asked about the Pumpkin Patch Event for 2020.

The Chairman, Jackie Daines explained that the Pumpkin Patch had now moved to a ticketing schedule, which staggered times of arrival for visitors to the site and reduced traffic congestion. A resident asked about the development of Hardings Close.

The Chairman reported that she had met with CBC Lewis Barber at the weekend to discuss speeding in Aldham. CBC Lewis Barber will contact Essex County Councillor Anne Brown to include this issue at the next Local Highways Panel in October. The Chairman suggested a questionnaire on speeding could be sent to local residents in Ford Street to complete and look at ways of reducing speeds in that area. The Chairman further suggested doing another Questionnaire in New Road & Brook Road once the Marks Tey Railway Bridge is open to reduce speeding in that area also. The Parish Clerk was actioned to prepare the Questionnaire.

The Clerk reported that the Community Speed Watch team cannot meet during the current COVID crisis.
